Founded in 1934 by Jewish leaders of trade union and Jewish organizations, the Jewish Labor Committee serves as the voice of the Jewish community in the labor movement, and the voice of the labor movement in the Jewish community. The JLC is an active support organization that mobilizes union members and others on behalf of a wide range of issues of shared concern to the Jewish community and labor.

Working closely with national and local Jewish agencies and the national labor movement, affiliated unions, and local labor leaders, the JLC advances a shared social and economic agenda for the benefit of all people in our society. At the same time, the JLC is influential within organized labor to garner the support of America's working families for Jewish communal concerns.

The JLC's presence is keenly felt in rallies, demonstrations, picket lines, organizing campaigns, contract disputes, corporate campaigns and other union-sponsored events and activities. JLC members work on behalf of labor causes in ways that unions are often unable to do for themselves.

Wherever union members find themselves attacked or besieged, the JLC is there for them. The JLC-Jewish-Labor partnership is a strong, vital relationship that benefits all workers and their families.

#### A National Reach
